**LA review the school** received a mini LA review, in all previous reviews our main focus had been English and Maths. Last week books and lessons were monitored in all our **foundation subjects** (those that aren't English or Maths) last week below is a summary of the outcomes:

Whilst teaching is not yet consistently good in all foundation lessons, it is having a greater impact on pupils' learning than previously. There is evidence of strong progress in books.

#### The strengths evident during the visit:

- 1) Pupils' conduct is routinely good
- 2) The schemes of work which the subject leaders have written are providing an effective support for non-specialist teachers of the foundation subjects to enable them to plan well to meet the individual learning needs of the pupils
- 3) The best teaching has teachers who are skilled at providing stretch and challenge to pupils from all prior attaining groups
- 4) Where subjects are taught by specialists, they address misconceptions with immediacy
- 5) The best teaching was effective in ensuring that the pupils listen when they are passing on information; the strategies they use include providing a 'hook' and speaking from their own experience
- 6) Almost all teachers use the agreed 'no hands up' approach to assessment
- 7) Most teachers apply the agreed feedback policy faithfully
- 8) In many cases, teachers provide useful opportunities for the pupils to develop their reasoning skills and to progress from using concrete apparatus to practical activities and then to understanding abstract concepts
- 9) The best teaching makes strong links with other subjects in their teaching

#### The weakest teaching had elements of the following:

- Teachers not routinely following the agreed schemes of work
- Teachers do not use 'casting off' well enough to make sure that pupils' progress in the lesson is maximised.
- Presentation in some books indicates that pupils' attitudes to learning are not strong enough yet.
- The weakest teaching did not move the pupils' learning on quickly enough.
- Teachers did not teach the skills of listening well enough

Please note we are immediately addressing the following in our training with staff on Monday 19/6/17

- Listening skills and how to ensure that all students are active listeners. Students should be able to tell you about the Hi Five listening skills by the end of the week.
- Presentation strategy re launched and the individual's students not meeting standards will be addressed as to poor presentation.
- Casting off, allowing students to go to work if they understand, but working again with those that don't will also be relaunched at our Staff meeting.

Please ask your child about the listening, presentation and casting off strategies at the end of next week, they should be aware and already feeling the effect. Alongside this, a coaching team has gone into support the staff that still need to make the leap into always 'good' lessons, in particular when they are outside of their subject.

After our SIAMs inspection which is due in June, we will hold one last Action Plan meeting for parents on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> July at 6pm. We will give you our clear progress to date and to hear your views about what you feel needs to be addressed next.
