## Year 7 Update and what is happening next week

Due to the Normandy visit, Year 7 have a few supply lessons next week. In order to support them, Mrs Gant will be taking groups of classes to explore a Geography challenge. Can they compete with the street children of Myanmar? Students will be exploring what life is like for many children in poverty in Myanmar. This relates to their Action Aid fund raising for two children from Myanmar. Students will compete by experiencing what it is like to work in the informal sector, and modelling how to build a shanty town house in a slum area of Myanmar. To do this, they will need to bring in any old newspapers for their first lesson with Mrs Gant and any cardboard, plastic or cleaned rubbish that could be modelled into a small basic model hut. Please note they will not be given any glue or scissors to create this task, so they will also need to be inventive as to how they will tie their rubbish together.
