Music news

What is happening during Action Aid on Thursday 4th April?

Edwinstree have been supporting Action Aid for about 35 years and have sponsored many children, mainly from India. We have raised almost £30,000 during this time and we currently sponsor a boy and a girl from the country of Myanmar. Their names are Min Khant Soe and Thu Zar Maw. Action Aid will take place on Thursday 4th April and we are planning to hold a cake sale in the morning. Please drop off any donations to the office the day before or on the morning. Thank you to our amazing bakers. Students will be asked to bring £2 in for a non-uniform day on the Thursday and also a little bit of money to spend at the Year 7 fete, which will take place at lunchtime. Most activities will be 20p or 50p with a maximum charge of £1.00. Thank you for your support with this.

Year 6

Please see below a comprehensive guide to revision strategies and activities we have provided for your child to get the most out of their Easter break.

English

- Work through CGP reading paper- this can be done 'test style' in one hour, or broken up into smaller chunks for revision. Use the mark scheme provided to check your answers.
- Work through CGP GPS paper, as above.
- Choose a few spellings a day from the ones we've covered this year to go over- are there any tricky rules you can fix?

Maths

- Pupils will be given their 2017 practise papers which they completed in class. Work through, following the worked example (to follow) and make corrections.
- Where there are areas of weakness, make some revision flashcards or posters to stick up around the house. This is an excellent strategy to remember multiplication tables or properties of shapes too.

Tips

- Start getting into a good bedtime routine. This means limiting screen time before bed (reading a book is an excellent alternative), and getting to bed at a good time.
- Eat well- plenty of protein will make your brain grow!
- Finally, and most importantly, remember to take time to relax. The ideal revision strategy is to do a little bit each day, which will leave plenty of time for fun and relaxation.

Year 6 Swimming

In the safeguarding training provided for students and parents this year, it was highlighted that this App is extremely vulnerable to adults accessing it as students. It poses as a music and photo sharing site, but has very little privacy settings available. We advise you check your child's Apps and find an alternative if they are using this site.

East Herts Community Safety Partnership

East Herts Community Safety Partnership has launched a Facebook page to allow for further engagement with local residents. The page will feature regular updates from police and East Herts Council around joint work to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour and to keep people safe. Neighbourhood Sergeant Mark Collins said: "We are keen to make the most of any opportunity to engage with the public. Most people have an online presence and use the internet for daily things such as online banking and shopping, so this is a great way to communicate and raise awareness of the work we are doing. Our presence as part of the East Herts CSP Facebook page will allow us to reach an audience who might not otherwise receive it. "We are particularly interested in interacting with social media users around issues such as setting our local policing priorities and demonstrating how we work together with our partners to keep East Herts a safe place to live. "We also welcome comments that local people may want to post on the site and, while we will do our best to answer questions and reply to posts, the site isn't monitored 24/7. It is not intended as a means for reporting crime or anti-social behaviour and people are encouraged to continue to use the usual contact

information to report incidents in their area, or dial 999 if there is an emergency."

A spokesperson for East Herts Council said: "The CSP page is a way of showing the community that we all work collectively to address issues in the district. It will help promote local and national campaigns, signpost people and provide a new way to engage with our communities."
