What is the latest update regarding COVID?

As of Thursday, we have reached 9 positive COVID cases across all year groups. We will alert you if your child has been in close contact with a child who has tested positive, so you can be extra vigilant with your testing on Wednesdays and weekends. Please be aware of the three symptoms and if your child develops a temperature, cough or loss of taste and smell, please seek a PCR test. If your child presents as unwell, please be cautious – Thank you Please be aware KS3 have been issued with new Testing Kits so they can continue to test on Wednesday and at the weekend. Please continue to log your results on the Government website Thank you.

How can I find out how my child is doing in school?

We will be send the majority of your child's books home at half term, so you can spend a little time with your child, finding out what they have been learning in their lessons. However, in Technology, students have not yet finished their project so their books will come home when the project has been completed which should be the end of November. Please make sure that all books are returned after half term. We will send books home again for Christmas.
