LA Review

A half day LA Review took place this week. As the previous September, November and January and February reviews have concentrated predominantly on our core subjects of English and Maths. The observations this time involved all the foundation (other subjects) and not our core. A summary of results will be with you in due course.

- What is the impact of Collective Worship on the school community?

Year 5 Educational Visit to Kew Gardens 14/1/17

In light of the latest terrorist attacks we have followed County and National advice and reviewed the risks of the Year 5 Educational visit to Kew, and we have made the decision to go ahead with the visit. On the day students must be at school at 8:40am to depart prompt at 9am. Expected return to Edwinstree is 4:30pm. Students not going on the visit will be expected to be in school as normal.

Year 8 Airspace Event

Mr Carter and the Year 8 team have booked an evening at the Airspace trampoline park in Stevenage on Thursday 13th July from 6-7pm. This is on a reward basis for students who have demonstrated a safe, caring and positive attitude throughout the year. Winston Churchill Day

During the Christian celebration of Epiphany we spent our time in Collective worship considering whether Jesus is a role model for 21st century boys and men? We spent time considering other role models of the 21st century. From every famous male role model considered, we learnt that their ability to communicate was important.

During this period of reflection Robbie Burns day took place and Ms Pike lead a discussion on these celebrations. We decided as a school that this year, we would like to celebrate an English male champion and students were able to volunteer suggestions and the most votes came in for Winston Churchill. (Please note next year we will celebrate a female role model) All students were offered the opportunity of planning the day and a small group have been working with us since April planning the event. There theme is to take

children back to the time when Winston was recognised as a hero during the Second World War, to try to experience and study life for a child in school during this time. They have planned the following for the Friday 23rd of June:

- A series of lessons period 1 – 4 exploring different themes and experiences for children during World War II.
- A house competition to find the winners of the Edwinstree 1940's 'Come Dancing' competition.
- A Street party (playground) in which we hope you forgive us but, students are allowed to bring in 1940's style sweets and they will be provided with a list of acceptable sweets
- A competition to provide the best Victoria Sponge cake.
