### What staff changes will take place next term?

Mrs Kelly will return for one week after Easter but then goes on maternity leave. Prior to September, Mr Bailey and Ms Elliott will teach RE lessons. After May half term, Ms Bustard our Lead for Humanities returns from maternity leave and will teach Humanities in Year 5 and Year 6 and History/RE for the last part of the year. Vicky will also help us to source seeds for our wild meadow and build bee hotels during Technology and Science lessons. We have kindly been offered free carp from a school in Bishops Stortford, who are moving to a new site, but we will need to call on our community fishermen to help us catch and transport the carp in the Summer term. The ESA has started in earnest to raise funds to support the expansion of the play surface area for students in winter. Due to the increase in numbers, we have outgrown our playgrounds, and however much we repair the grass areas for children to play, you know how muddy they can get.

### Parent Survey results

Thank you to those parents who found the time to complete the online Parent Questionnaire. I apologise to the kind parent or two that tried to tell me, that the SEND question and bullying question was going to create really unclear results. As we had lifted this from the Ofsted Questionnaire, I had assumed the questions would provide clear results, but I had missed that there are extra tabs on the Ofsted questionnaire ie are you SEND? Has your child suffered from bullying? Was it dealt with effectively? Therefore, our results are not a true reflection and we will address this next week in the hope of getting a clearer picture, but we found out the following:

We were really pleased to see that the vast majority of students feel happy, safe and are doing well in school. It was noted that six students felt unsafe in school, please contact us so we can address any issues your child may have as we are here to help.

The majority of parents feel that we make sure students are well behaved, when concerns are raised they are dealt with well. After Easter, we will set up a focus groups and invite parents to talk to us and discuss behaviour and expectations. We also plan to further explore communication between school and parent, which has been severely impeded by Covid. We have also noted that while the majority believe there is a good range of clubs and personal development, a proportion of parents disagree and we need to find out more.

To help you get to know us better, the ESA suggested we host an open afternoon and evening towards the end of term. This will give students the opportunity to show parents around the school, see their work and meet their teachers. We think this is lovely idea and have earmarked the 13th July from 2pm - 7pm.

### Did someone say, 'School Production'?

Yes! We are aiming to put on the musical 'Pirates of the Curry Bean' in the first week of July – dates to be confirmed before Easter. This play is a lot of fun and ties into our school's vision of 'supporting one another to live life to all its fullness'.

Acting / chorus auditions will take place on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> March, with singing auditions for the **main parts** taking place on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> March. Both of these auditions will run

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until 4.15pm. If your child wishes to take a lead part, they need to attend both rehearsals. Auditions will be open to all year groups, but Y6 should consider their SATS preparations - we don't want to add any more pressure onto them at this time.
