# How can I support my child to be safe and secure online? 4<sup>th</sup> of July talks:

We have invited in an independent online safety expert, Karl Hopwood, to talk to our students and parents about online safety. There will be a session for KS2 students and a separate session for KS3 students. Although we haven't finalised the exact content it is likely to include the following:

- The importance of thinking carefully about what you post.
- Who am I talking to online and why does this matter?
- Fake news and mis/disinformation online.
- Scams how to spot them and how to deal with them.
- Cyberbullying what to do if it happens and the importance of being an upstander as opposed to a bystander.
- Issues around screen time.
- Should I report concerns and how do I do it?

At the moment we have a limited response to the Parent session. We have sent reminders, but have now extended our invite to Parents of local schools. Parents are invited into the school between 5.30-6.30pm to attend a talk based around keeping your child safe on the internet.
