They have worked hard over the week and managed their wellbeing. The rest of the community have been very considerate and supported them by staying quiet during the morning movement between lessons.

Hertfordshire County Council notice: Walk to School Week 16-20 May 2022

With so many children leading sedentary lifestyles, we want to encourage active school journeys which can help towards children achieve 60 minutes of activity every day.

Government guidelines recommend that children and young people should get 30 minutes of their daily physical activity in the school day and 30 minutes outside of school. In a recent study, children that exercised before school had improved

concentration levels in school. With regular physical activity children improve cardiorespiratory fitness, build strong bones and muscles, control weight and reduce symptoms of anxiety and depression.

Hertfordshire's Walk to School Week has previously won a National Award for Excellence in Walking with Modeshift STARS which recognises an excellence in cycling, walking and other forms of sustainable travel. Over 50 percent of Hertfordshire primary schools took part, encouraging active travel to school.

Please support Walk to School Week and ask children to walk, cycle, scoot or use any other forms of sustainable travel they can think off.

Years 5-8: Live performance from solo artist "Lex Gibbon" On the 19th May 2022, as part of a review of online behaviours and risks, we will have a Live performance from solo artist "Lex Gibbon" followed on with a talk on Mental Health, Body Image/Cyber Bullying & a live Q&A for all students.

Originally from Hertfordshire, Lex is the first plus size teenager to walk the catwalk in London, New York & Paris Fashion week. Lex was badly bullied at school which led to her having her own mental health / body image issues, so she feels she is in the perfect position to speak to young people about these very important issues that teenagers face. Her talks look to inspire others to believe they can achieve anything — but to be conscious and wary of oversharing on social media and the impacts this can have. Further talks will be offered in July to students and Parents based on how to stay safe online.

When is Year 6 Science and Foundation Parents Evening and what is happening?

This will take place on Tuesday 17th May, running from 4pm until 6pm. Unlike the Maths and English evenings, there are no booked appointments. You come to school at any time between 4pm and 6pm and it is an opportunity for your child to take you to their classrooms and show you what they have been doing this year.
