What was the result of the questionnaire about trips?

A huge thank you to all those parents that supported us to understand how much you were able to spend on trips, and activities. We will now go ahead and plan our events based around this information. For both Year 8 and Year 6 you asked for a residential but within a set pricing bracket. We will publish the results next week.

What events are coming up before and just after half term and how can you help?

Conkers Bonkers. Oh, my goodness, I have never seen so many conkers! Thank you for the gargantuan effort and I really hope you enjoyed collecting them too!

Coming home with your child are 4 conkers and information on how they might choose to harden their conker (we are not guaranteeing any of these methods work). Attached is a link to a video showing you how to help your child make a hole in their conker and tie string to them. If you can do this with the four conkers we would very much appreciate it.

2 conkers are for practicing at home with, and 2 conkers are to be returned to school for the tournament on Friday. We have posted the information up on SMHW but are stressing to children they must make the holes with the supervision from an adult.

Why are we doing this? The Church of England asks us to Live life in all its Fullness and for the last couple of year this has meant planning fun and joy into our cycle of learning. During these events and after half term in the Autumn walk we will be learning: Fun can be had outside at very little cost — and is really good for our wellbeing.

What about the stargazing event when is it, and how can my child attend?

We are inviting children of Edwinstree and their families to join the ESA for a stargazing event on 21st October from 6pm to 8pm. This is a free event for families to attend together, but we only have enough spaces for 100 children from Edwinstree and their families. An Expert will be there with the Science team to talk on what we hope to see, how to use a telescope etc. You can bring your own binoculars and telescopes if you are lucky enough to have them. This is particularly relevant for year 5 and 8 who are covering this topic in Science but all families are welcome.

Please note if you have a child in a lower school or upper who wants to attend with your child and Mum, Dad and/or Carer etc they are welcome but please include them on the list.

The ESA will be selling hot drinks, marshmallows and snacks. We would encourage people to bring reusable insulated cups for hot drinks, along with warm clothing, blanket to lie on and binoculars or telescopes (but not necessary). Downloading a free stargazing app onto a mobile phone could also be useful. You will be spending most of the two hours laying down looking at the stars so wrap up warm and make sure you have warm blankets.

What happens if the weather forecast is poor? If we are unlikely to see stars we have an indoor activity using our hall screen as planetarium. But if he weather is awful we will postpone for post half term.

What events are coming up after half term?

Originally, we had planned for our Autumn walk to take place next week, but with Staff COVID absence we have delayed this. Instead Autumn walk will take place on Tuesday 8th November. We have moved the date of our Autumn walk in order to make sure that we don't waste our conkers, part of the walk will be our local woodlands looking at the places the deer and muntjac inhabit. We will be leaving our broken conkers for the animals to eat. Would you be willing to help us out with the walk? We need Parent, Carer, Grandparents volunteers.
