# What about the heat for last week of term?

You will be aware that the severe weather warning for Monday has now risen to red. Hertfordshire County Council and the Department for Education are not advising schools to close, although they are recommending that we take measures such as ventilating rooms, switching off electrical devices, closing blinds and keeping students out of direct sun.

Therefore, we currently intend to be open on Monday. We will follow national guidance in order to look after everyone while they are in school. Students should make sure that they bring a water bottle with them and can continue to wear PE kit to keep cool.

We will continue to review the situation over the weekend and we will be in touch if there are any changes to our plans.

I am mindful that everyone's circumstances are different. There may be considerations such as your son or daughter's health or the nature of their journey to and from home which mean that you do not feel it is sensible for them to come to school while a red warning is in place.

### Will there be homework over the holidays?

We are really keen for your child to have fun and a break – you all need it, but we couldn't recommend more that you keep them reading.

The Summer reading challenge is outlined below. 20 minutes, 5 days a week. We don't mind what they read, cooking recipes, the football news- but do work on encouraging your child to do this.

But with any game please talk to your child about strategy – what you are thinking and how you are planning ahead. Get them to see the inside of what your brain is doing, when its game playing. Getting students to budget and have responsibility for money is a great way to help.

# Lancaster Model - Year 5 currently/ year 6 in September 2022

# IMPORTANT: ASSESSING YEAR 6 CHILDREN'S HEALTH & WELLBEING THROUGH THE LANCASTER MODEL

For the last few years, the Public Health Nursing Service has been using an online health assessment, called the Lancaster Model, to identify health needs of children. All Year 6 children will be given the opportunity to complete a questionnaire in school, during a normal school day. Members of the school nursing team will be present when the children complete the questionnaire to support any child that may need assistance when completing it, or to offer support afterwards. Please find attached to the newsletter a letter for Year 6 Parent/ Carers.

# What is the Lancaster Model (TLM)

TLM is an online questionnaire and is a way of identifying any early health and wellbeing needs children may have. It asks them about things that might affect their health, such as lifestyle, emotional wellbeing, and moving to secondary school. If it shows a child might benefit from some additional support from the school nursing team, they will discuss this with you and contact the child's parents or carers to discuss further. The results of the questionnaire also show wider trends so we can plan what services or support will be needed for children in the future.
