What have we been talking about in COWO?

This week we have continued our introduction to what it means to be a Church of England school. We have focused on the story of the Vineyard owner who pays all his workers the same amount whatever time of day they started work after being collected from the market! To start with, this story can provoke outrage, however, when it is explained that the vineyard owner recognises that the people in the market who are waiting to be picked to work for the day to feed their hungry families at home, have more stress by not being picked at the start of the day then going to work – it finishes with a story the last shall come first and the first shall come last.

In a modern-day context, it means the following: We will commit really hard to support and make sure that all families facing the cost of living crisis are not put under pressure.
