Please note we can't have canvas due to health and safety regulations in our Science and DT rooms.

When is the school closed to students?

The school will be closed on Friday the 24th of June and Monday the 27th of June. We hope you get the opportunity to enjoy the long weekend as families, we will look forward to seeing students again on the 28th of June. This is also the Year 8 parent consultation date.

What day can I attend the parents talk about how to keep my child safe on line?

You will be aware from the weekly newsletter that the school has been tracking online safety issues a great deal this year. During the height of Covid and more recently, online behaviours of some of our students have remained an issue and so the school subsequently delivered a PSHE programme of study to support years 7 and 8. To further support this, these year groups have watched the BBC documentary titled *Murder Games: The Life and Death of Breck Bednar*.

On July 4th we have invited in an independent online safety expert, Karl Hopwood, to talk to our students and parents about online safety. There will be a session for KS2 students and a separate session for KS3 students. Although we haven't finalised the exact content it is likely to include the following:

- The importance of thinking carefully about what you post.
- Who am I talking to online and why does this matter?
- Fake news and mis/disinformation online.
- Scams how to spot them and how to deal with them
- Cyberbullying what to do if it happens and the importance of being an upstander as opposed to a bystander.
- Issues around screen time.
- Should I report concerns and how do I do it?

Our guest speaker is Karl Hopwood. Karl is an independent online safety expert. He is a member of UKCIS (UK Council for Internet Safety) and sits on the UKCIS evidence group, education working group and the early warning group as well as on the advisory board for the UK Safer Internet Centre. He also sits on Twitter's trust and safety council and the Roblox trust and safety board where he represents the Insafe network. He was recently part of an expert steering group with TikTok looking at harmful and dangerous online challenges.

Karl has worked for a number of key players in the UK and abroad including CEOP (Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre), BECTA (British Educational and Communications Technology Agency), the European Commission, the UN and several Local Authorities within the UK and in Europe.

As an ex primary headteacher, he continues to work closely to develop safer online behaviours and the promotion of digital literacy in schools across Europe with children, young people, parents, teachers and governors.

As a Christian school we recognise the unique and wonderful in everyone. As a community we support one another to flourish and live life in all its fullness.

Karl has been employed for the last 15 years as an inhouse consultant for INSAFE which is the coordinating node of the EU Better Internet for Kids programme where he is responsible for the coordination of safer internet helplines across Europe. Karl was the Chair of the Board of Trustees of the Marie Collins Foundation for 7 years, a charity which supports young people who have been sexually abused and exploited online and continues to be a trustee of Childnet International and an executive committee member of SACPA (Safeguarding and Child Protection Association). Karl has recently worked with a team developing a national online safety strategy in Rwanda and chaired the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) working group to rewrite their Child Online Protection Guidance.

What is happening on the Felixstowe trip?

Year 5 will be asked to attend the day in PE kit – please keep an eye on the weather, regardless of rain or shine, students will spend the day outside. Year 7 can attend in non- school uniform. We plan to leave once students have registered at 8.40 in their tutor rooms. We should arrive at Felixstowe for 10.30 am. We will walk students along the area of the promenade that they will have access to for the day. Along this walk there will be various teaching staff and volunteer parents and carers who will position themselves at key points to offer activities or to monitor. The activities on offer are:

- Kite flying (we are proving kites)
- Crabbing (we are providing nets lines and bate!)
- Fishing there is a point for fishing, students will need to sign up to say they are bringing their rod and a sealed container with bait. Students will bring the rods at their own risk.
- Digging to Australia, sandcastles and paddling –
 please would students bring a bucket and spade if
 they wish to do this.
- Activities you may wish to pay for a small fair ground with rides and a pier with all the slot machines you would expect from a seaside beach area.
- Opportunities to buy ice cream and candy floss etc.

Last year those who were lucky enough to go on the trip really enjoyed themselves and a traditional day at the seaside we can't wait to spend time with them having fun.

Please note students don't need money to enjoy the trip, there are enough activities for them to do. But if you are providing them with some, please no more that £20.

Year 7 - <u>No ingredients needed</u>. After a great taste testing session of different cakes made with sugar alternatives, it is your turn next week to start the food science experiment. Ingredients are provided by the school for this.
