What is the latest guidance from the DfE on COVID in schools?

Please see the attached information from the DFE, please be aware we have no test kits to distribute to students. If you discover your child has COVID they will need to isolate for a minimum of 3 days, however we would continue to urge that they do not return until they test negative. We will seek further information to secure clarity in the expectations of you as a parent and us as a school. If an outbreak occurs, COVID measures may be returned on the advice of Public Health. What is the biggest risk to school closure?

A significant number of staff catching COVID and no supply available due to the demand for supply teachers in the area as many schools are in the same position.

What news is there from our new formed ESA (Edwinstree School Association formed by Parents)?

Attached is a newsletter from our newly formed ESA. I am so pleased to have a set of parents working to support the school to raise funds and provide enrichment activities for your children.

Spring Disco - The Edwinstree School Association (ESA) is very excited to announce that a Spring Disco will be held for all year groups on Friday 13th May, from 6.30 to 8.30pm. Tickets will be £5 each and will include a cake and a packet of crisps, as well as unlimited water/squash (children will be required to bring their own drinks bottle so that we can minimise waste). A local DJ will be providing the music and the children may wish to bring some pocket money to spend at the sweet stall! All proceeds will go to the ESA, who are currently raising funds to improve the outdoor spaces and facilities available to the children. When will we get the next progress reports?

Progress Reports will be sent home in the second week of the Summer term and will give you the latest attainment for your child.

When are the Parents Evenings for foundation subjects and how will they operate?

Foundation subjects are those that do not form part of the Core subjects - English, Maths, and Science. We are returning to our tried and tested method of parents evening prior to COVID for all foundation subjects.

We have Y5 (Tuesday 3rd May) and Y6 (Tuesday 17th May) Foundation Parent Evenings this term, running from 4pm until 6pm.

Unlike the Maths and English evenings there will be no bookable appointments. You can arrive at school any time between 4pm and 6pm and it is an opportunity for your child to take you to their classrooms and show you what they have been doing this year. Class teachers will be in classrooms to answer any questions you may have about the subject or their learning.

If you feel you may need a longer conversation with a subject teacher, you will be able to leave your contact details on the way out.

What are the school plans for this term?

We have been working hard with your child to help them recover their learning. You will see from the Parents and Data reports that students have grown in confidence and are now beginning to make rapid progress.

To help them this year we have been focusing on:

- Curriculum threshold concepts these are the key pieces of learning that are essential for students to secure before they can progress. You can find the curriculum maps with the threshold concepts on our website for each subject.
- Formative assessment not waiting for big assessments to check whether a student has secured all their learning for the lesson through mini tests, white board use etc, and if they have not, not progressing until it is secure.
- Literacy and Numeracy we are chanting timetables in lots of starter lessons around the school, and we have been focusing on ensuring that students spelling, grammar and punctuation improves. In particular we have been working on Proper Nouns, when you use a capital and when not to. Students presentation have also been a target.

To support student wellbeing, we have been:

- Looking to re-promote and support spirituality and reflection through COWO – this term we return to exploring values and the value we will work on is that of Friendship.
- Support students to have a voice and to learn that where you have a concern you can do something about this. We focused on climate change and students signed up to a small change they could make
- We are now working as a school on becoming a zero-waste school. Fullness days are part of our drive to support students to have a voice and to do something about a concern they have.
- Support students to have dignity and respect for each other. This year our BAME group have been working hard to help us to make sure this group is supported and cared for in the school and that their voice is heard.
- Returning us to a "real school" that despite COVID
 we are able to run trips, theatre groups, musical
 concerts etc. Fingers crossed we have a respite
 from COVID and we are able to fulfil the plans
 listed in the timetable as your children need some
 fun!

What social media concerns do I wish to alert you to.

Attached is a letter for year 7 and 8 parents that was sent on Thursday and is information for key stage 2 parents. It was to highlight the poor use of social media that we have seen over the last term by key stage 3 students. As a result, we are moving our PSHE curriculum for KS3 to safety online and for KS2 post half term. We will be inviting you as a parent to a safety talk with an outside speaker (details to follow). In the meantime, we wish to encourage you to make sure you are monitoring your child's phone use at least once a week and that you have safeguarded their use with the CEOPs information and guidance that is outlined in the letter. We are also asking students to turn their mobile phones off as they come in the school gate and to only turn them on, when they leave the site.

What is Edwinstree's Summer uniform?

Students can now wear a white polo shirt instead of a shirt and tie, the remainder of the uniform remains the same. Uniform list is available on our website. We are checking student uniform this week, and you may receive a phone call asking you to support us to return your child to the appropriate uniform. We are aware where there is SEND need there are students who have an agreed exception. Please be reminded that no jewellery except a watch and only one set of stud earrings, no make-up or any nail products Thankyou

Year 8 Transition what is happening?

We will be meeting with Freman to begin the transition process for Year 8. We will arrange early transition for our most vulnerable students, to meet their link tutor and or the SEND team, with visits to the Redgrave Centre and the school site. What is happening with the first school?

Hertfordshire County Council were very grateful to Edwinstree community for the offer to help for this year. However, the planned start for the new school has now been delayed a further year.

Please see below information shared on the HCC website: 'Buntingford First School is a brand new school planned to open in the south of Buntingford in September 2023 which will initially offer 30 Reception places alongside a nursery class and will also offer places in Year 1 to Year 4 to meet any in-year local demand. The county council is working with the Scholars Education Trust who will run the school and are excited about the opportunity to add to the excellent education offer already available in the town. The school was originally planned to open this September but delays in the planning process mean that the school will now open in its brand new buildings in September 2023.

Buntingford First will be a pilot to achieve the first fully net zero carbon school in the county, in line with county council's carbon neutral ambitions.

Prospective parents will be able to apply for a place at the new school through the standard admissions process at Hertfordshire online admissions. The new school will be open to pupils across all other year groups from September 2023 – parents will be able to make an in year application for a place in years 1-4 in the summer term prior to opening.'

Walk to School Week 16-20 May 2022

With so many children leading sedentary lifestyles, we want to encourage active school journeys which can help towards children achieve 60 minutes of activity every day.

Government guidelines recommend that children and young people should get 30 minutes of their daily physical activity in the school day and 30 minutes outside of school. In a recent study, children that exercised before school had improved concentration levels in school. With regular physical activity children improve cardiorespiratory fitness, build strong bones and muscles, control weight and reduce symptoms of anxiety and depression.

Hertfordshire's Walk to School Week has previously won a National Award for Excellence in Walking with Modeshift STARS which recognises an excellence in cycling, walking and other forms of sustainable travel. Over 50 percent of Hertfordshire primary schools took part, encouraging active travel to school.

Please support Walk to School Week and ask children to walk, cycle, scoot or use any other forms of sustainable travel they can think off.
