# What events are happening this half term?

This is a very short and busy half term. We will be completing our Easter services in the last week of half term, we will endeavour to include an Egg hunt!

Contributions that we will ask you to support are, a £1 donation for "Onesie Wednesday" taking place on the Fullness day to support the drama production and baked goods with an Easter theme for the student's walk to the Church and back.

# Why did my child have supply staff at the start of term?

We continue to see staff and students suffering from a flu/COVID like illness, myself included in this. We are working hard to source supply, while we navigate this period of ill health in the school. Post COVID we still experience flu symptoms and sickness more frequently and more rigorous than anything before COVID. Please may we ask again that you are mindful not to send your child in, if they have flu and COVID like symptoms. While we will do everything in our power to keep the school open, please ensure you do have a back-up plan if we have to close a year group due to staffing issues. Please note, if we must make this decision, we will begin with the older year groups who are much less likely to need supervision at home and therefore cause less disruptive for parents.

We are also incredibly sad to announce that our Head of English Mrs Hayes is still very poorly and has made the decision to resign due to ill health. We are currently looking to source an English teacher for the remainder of the school year. We have managed to secure a teacher for this half term and Mrs Mayne our Deputy and former Head of English, is setting the lessons and supporting them. Both the school and Mrs Hayes are deeply saddened by this decision. Our current priority is to manage the students well being through another change and to secure their learning.

We are exploring how we support the two year 6 classes in their lead up to SATS, and we will write to parents next week to explain what strategies we are putting in place.

# Year 5 Whipsnade Zoo Educational Visit – 23<sup>rd</sup> April

We are delighted to be able to offer Year 5 the opportunity to visit Whipsnade Zoo. Our next unit in Humanities has a Geography focus. We will be learning about different climates and biomes and the unique plants and animals that live within them. Visiting the zoo will help bring to life this learning. Whipsnade is the UK's biggest Zoo and is home to 3,626 animals, many of which are endangered in the wild. The children will experience the heat and humidity of the tropics in the butterfly house, meet giraffes from the African savannah face-to-face at the custom-built high-level viewing platform and walk through the new Monkey Forest habitat which is opening this Easter. Each form will decide where they will visit and move around the zoo together attending talks that the Zookeeper team offer throughout the day.


# Food and Nutrition:
