Takes place on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> December.


If your child would like a Christmas lunch, please ensure you order via SchoolGrid. Cost is £3.50, payments are made via the SchoolGrid website.

#### Year 5 News

## You said, We did

Thank you to those Parent/ Carers that completed our Year 5 parent survey- your feedback is greatly appreciated and helps us improve.

Below we have focused on your suggestions and how we will respond.

You Said	We did
"PE kit on PE days"	We do all-weather PE which means they get muddy/wet. However, we recognise that postcovid many schools moved to wearing PE kit all day. We do review the decision about PE kits every year.
"Feedback and Meeting with Tutor has not happened"	We held a "Meet the Tutor" event on Tuesday 30 <sup>th</sup> September where there was the opportunity to liaise with the tutor. Attendance to this evening was less than 40%. If you ever want to discuss your child let us know and we will reach out.
"Less Home-Learning"	Liaison with first schools suggested we were setting less than they did in Y4- we will go back and look again.
"Concerns in school"	We will always listen. We are human and do not get everything right, please do always talk to us.
"More Transition"	We are looking to run more visits throughout the school year, such as delivering a PE lesson.
"In year entry- delayed start?"	If we are taking a mid-year student, we have to collect data from their current school and meet them and yourselves. This does make the process slower but we want to ensure we have as much information as we can to help your child have a smooth start to the school and succeed with us. Thank you for your patience.
"Extra SEND and Well-being support"	EHCP and SEND families are encouraged to meet the SEND team prior to starting to consider how we can best support your child.  Over the summer, the wellbeing hub holds sessions for new students to come in when the school is quiet.  We have offered open afternoons this term for parents to book in and visit the Learning and Wellbeing Hubs. Several parents have taken up this opportunity. If your child ever requires support, please do contact us.
"Apps and Forms were confusing"	We agree, it was a new system this year and there were teething issues. We will look to create a better timed and more streamlined communication of this.

## Wellbeing Survey

Since Covid many of us are talking about wellbeing a great deal more. Some of us have noticed that we are ourselves struggling with our wellbeing and perhaps our children are struggling too. At Edwinstree we do our very best to support through our tutors, pastoral teams and the wellbeing hub.

We are keen to track wellbeing within the school and are looking to perform a very short wellbeing survey called the Stirling Children's Wellbeing Scale. It is a very simple age-appropriate survey with 12 questions and has been used by many schools and outside organisations such as CAHMS.

By using such a simple survey, we can also compare ourselves to the average score. The idea is that we repeat the survey for 3 times within the year to track the overall direction of wellbeing within the school and we can also see whether there are particular groups (i.e. a year group, boys/girls) that are impacted more.

# Stranger Things Age Rating

We hope you are not offended but we wanted as a staff to flag our concerns about younger children anticipating watching this drama.

Netflix's *Stranger Things* has been given a **15 certificate** in the UK. This rating reflects the show's mature themes, including violence, frightening imagery, and occasional strong language.

- What the rating means: Officially, the BBFC advises that children under 15 should not watch.
- Your role as parents: Ultimately, you know your child best. Some young people may be more sensitive to scary or intense content, while others may handle it differently.
- **Guidance not rules:** The certificate is there to help you make informed choices, but it is not a substitute for parental judgment.
- Practical tip: If your child is interested, consider watching an episode together first. That way, you can decide whether the tone and content feel appropriate for them.
