Mobile Phone Usage at school

Last week we wrote to you about mobile phone usage in school lessons given our current limited number of school devices and our desire to source more going forward. In particular, we highlighted that there would be occasions when we currently need to use them in Lifeskills lessons, and indeed this is one of the subjects where we study the safe use of phones. We now also recognise that there will similarly be a limited number of computing lessons that may require the use of mobile phones, for example when studying "computer networking." Computing lessons, alongside Lifeskills, is a second place where we study the safe usage of the internet. Your child will not miss out if they don't have a phone as we have a small number of chrome devices but not enough for a class set.

Notice from Director of Education

Since December 2020, the Local Authority has been able to provide supermarket vouchers to families, supported through government funding streams. From October 2021 onwards, this was funded through the Household Support Fund, a national programme from the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) designed to help households with the cost of living.

The government has now confirmed that the Household Support Fund will come to an end in 2025. Unfortunately, this means we will no longer be able to issue vouchers to children who are entitled to benefit-related free school meals for the holiday periods.

We understand that this change may be difficult for some families, and we want to reassure you that support is still available. If you feel you may need additional help, we encourage you to visit the Hertfordshire County Council 'Cost of Living Support' pages on the council website, where you can find information about a range of services and assistance options.

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
