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Ofsted report - what happens next?

We were pleased to be able to share with you our recent report, we believe it to be a fair and a good reflection of the school. It was lovely to hear that the inspector recognised how respectful and tolerant our children are of each other, and to all differences. She also highlighted the significant and extensive breadth and depth of learning which your child experiences, and which results in Edwinstree students being well prepared for Freman.

I would like to thank Freman and Mrs Loughran personally for the significant partnership work they have supported us with, to allow all our teaching and learning to link to their curriculum.

The inspector recognised the positive impact of the strong Church of England values, and personal and wellbeing programmes within our school that allow our community to feel safe and appreciated. Both staff and students are proud to be part of Edwinstree and so am I.

As a Christian school we recognise the unique and wonderful in everyone. As a community we support one another to flourish and live life in all its fullness. Our two areas of development will now form part of our school improvement plan which I will publish at the start of the new academic year in September. The first is something recommended, that further work needs to be completed on how we ensure that all students are clear what they need to do to improve in each subject. We also know that you are keen to see their books so that you can see our steers to them, as to what they need to improve on next and what plans are in place to support this.

The saddest part of the inspection for me was to see a minority but a significant one, from some SEND families who felt our communication could be improved greatly. As you will be aware the SEND need has exploded nationally post COVID, and we now have above the national numbers of SEND pupils with Education Health Care Plans, at a time when deep relative cuts have been made to all public services, and funding is stretched beyond anything I have seen as a Head for the last 17 years.

I was relieved that the Ofsted inspector could see that we had prioritised supporting all students and that the impact of this was that SEND learning gaps are closing, and they are catching up with reading, writing and maths, but we now have considerable work to do, to help provide a better communication process to all SEND parents to inform you of our actions and their success.

I will therefore be writing to all SEND parents next week and then writing to all parents in the newsletter to invite you into school for an evening with SLT, to hear your viewpoints on how we can improve communication, what that might look and feel like for you? But within the constraints and limitations of a public service that is currently inadequately funded, and/or led by County. It should be an interesting evening for us!

If you would be willing to spend 1 hour and 15 minutes with us on 3rd July 2024 and share with us your viewpoint, you are very welcome. We will publish in advance the questions we are looking to explore and our current constraints within the service we offer, so that we can have an honest but realistic discussion.

What about communication as a whole?

One of the things the Ofsted improvements plan has helped me to realise is, that the method of communication that I learnt and feel comfortable with, appeared before mobile phones. But for many parents now, you had mobile phones as teens and this is your means of communication, so I am aware I will be taking a new journey to find new ways of helping you to see, hear and feel part of our school and the good work that is taking place.

Year 7 news:

Globe Theatre Trip – 12th June 2024

We are delighted to be able to offer Year 7 the opportunity to visit The Globe Theatre. Our English unit in the summer term is based on Shakespeare's 'Romeo and Juliet', and The Globe offers a fantastic interactive workshop that will enable students to explore the play's characters and themes.

Students will need to bring with them:

- Full school uniform with comfortable shoes or trainers.
- A waterproof coat
- A packed lunch [no glass bottles please]
- A small backpack [to be carried throughout the day]
- Pocket money to visit the Gift Shop no more than £10.
- Any medication [including travel sickness tablets] clearly labelled with their name to be handed to the office.

On the day of the visit, students need to **arrive at school by 8:40am** for a prompt departure at 9:15am. We will leave The Globe at 2pm and arrive back at Edwinstree at approximately 3.30pm. Alternative travel arrangements need to be made for those who use school transport.

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Year 8 news:

HPV Vaccinations

Please find attached a letter from the NHS regarding our HPV immunisation taking place for year 8 on Tuesday 18th June. A response is required. You must accept or decline this vaccination by completing the online form in using the link in the letter. The electronic link will close at 2PM on Monday, June 17, 2024

Please note the form will not work on some mobile phones and tablets. Please call 0300 555 5055 if you are unable to complete it online.

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) immunisation

The HPV vaccination helps protect boys and girls from HPVrelated cancers. This virus increases the risk of developing some cancers later in life, such as cervical cancer, some mouth and throat cancers and some cancers of the anus and genital areas. In line with the National Immunisation Programme, Hertfordshire Community NHS Trust's School Aged Immunisation Service offers the HPV vaccination to all eligible boys and girls in year 8. From September 2023 the guidance form the UK Healthy Security Agency (UKSHA) and The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) is that most children will only require a single dose of the HPV vaccination. Children and young people who are immunosuppressed may require three doses. The change reflects evidence building up over recent years from a range of studies from around the world that shows that a single dose of the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine offers robust protection that is comparable to 2 doses. Based on the evidence, other countries, such as Australia and Scotland, have already made the move to one dose.

On the date of vaccination, we will see the whole year group. It is important for you to discuss and complete the consent form with your child, so they are aware of your wishes.
