Students will be continuing to look at how we can as a school and a community, make our lives better whilst maintaining and improving the environment. Before Christmas our day revolved around reducing energy, for this day the students voiced they would like to consider wildlife and habitats and how we look after them. The key theme is always that we can all do a little something to make a difference. Students will be in normal lessons but will be able to volunteer for one of the free talks and activities available on the day. Here is a list of some of the talks they have on offer:

- Food and Farming
- Sustainability in Action

- Eco bricks
- How does a local horse charity, support students to learn about healing through horses?
- Build a bug palace
- Honey Bees and their habitats

- School clean up Eco warriors of the future
- Growing our own food and how we can use it.

How to get ready for next year?
