Junior Park Run

are pleased to share the news that they are bringing a new junior parkrun to Buntingford this month.

Junior Parkruns are much like Saturday morning Parkruns, except they are run over a shorter 2km distance, and are for junior participants aged from 4 up to 14. They are all volunteer led, and participation is free. The parkrun movement is very much about encouraging participation in a non-competitive environment; we encourage gentle jogging and walking as well as running, and we also encourage younger participants to consider being part of the volunteering side of parkrun too.

The first event will be held on Sunday March 17th at Norfolk Road Playing Fields, next door to Edwinstee. The course encompasses both the Norfolk Road field and the Edwinstee school field.

Prior to the official launch on 17th March, they are running a test event next Sunday 10th March. Participants are encouraged to register their details on the parkrun site to obtain their personal barcode, which can be used at all parkrun events to track their own progress and earn awards each time they reach a milestone: <u>https://www.parkrun.org.uk/register/</u>
