It is going to be hot next week – On Monday we are offering your child the opportunity to attend school in PE kit. Unperfumed sun cream, sun hats and sunglasses are welcome. We will let you know on Monday if they can continue to wear PE kit for the remainder of the week.

What is happening this term?

The school continues to focus on its school improvement plan priorities to support children in all subjects, to engage and practise their reading skills. We are also working hard to support students to maintain or improve their wellbeing through the mental health sessions in the morning, and our exploration of spirituality. We have the opportunity this term to maximise our outdoor spaces and beautiful countryside so you will hear and see your child participate in trips to the sea, a long walk to the church at Wyddial, a picnic, sports day, and a Fullness day that focuses on looking after nature with the help of a variety of environmental groups who will be in working and talking to students.

We also have the time to reflect on the year and to wish our departing year 8's a warm goodbye and to celebrate their time with us.

This year we are looking to add a celebration event to our calendar at the end of term, in order to support those students who quietly work hard and succeed in lessons and/or represent one of our values- more information next week.

If you have an athletics champion then please make a note of the Sports day and reserve Sports day. On Sports day we invite you for a picnic lunch and to see our students complete in a variety of races over the afternoon.

Please remember that we have cancelled our inset day on the 30th of June due to the calendar error I made. However, if you have already booked an event for the family we accept this as this is my error.

New timings – September 2023

From September we will be increasing the length of the school day by five minutes, to comply with the Government's expectation that all mainstream, state-funded schools should provide a school week of at least 32.5 hours. Our new timings will be **8.40am to 3.10pm**. Staff are currently being consulted as to where we put these five minutes within the school day.

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What other changes will we see in September?

Part of what we want to bring back is student ownership of their belongings and equipment. During and post COVID, we have supported students by giving out equipment. With the cost of living crisis in school, we are no longer able to do this, and we believe that as part of being 'Ready to Learn' and showing commitment to learning - all students should have their own equipment from September. We are sharing this equipment list now to give you plenty of time to make sure students are ready for September. The following list is what we expect students to have:

- Pencil case
- Blue or black pens
- Green pen
- HB pencil
- Ruler (30cm measured in cm and mm)
- Rubber
- Sharpener
- Whiteboard pen/rubber
- Glue stick
- Small pack of colouring pencils
- KS3: Scientific calculator (available to purchase at a discounted price through the school)
- Optional: Highlighter pens

Each week we will introduce our tweaks and changes in preparation for next year. Next week we will be introducing how we will be 'pushing the positive' more in school. Where we are proposing changes, you will have opportunities to comment in order to help shape our thoughts plans and actions.

Food and Nutrition:
