What is happening on the last day of term?

As a Christian school we recognise the unique and wonderful in everyone. As a community we support one another to flourish and live life in all its fullness.

What are our snow procedures?

With the forecast as it is, we felt it was time to dust off the snow procedures that we have not used in the last 3 years as many parents will be unfamiliar with what we do if there is significant snow.

We will post on our website and Facebook, send a Parentmail and notify the Hertfordshire information services if we are closing the school. This decision will be made in conjunction with the local Headteachers in Buntingford.

If snow is heavy overnight and leads to a closure the next morning, we will ensure that the Parentmail, website and Facebook are updated by 7:45am at the latest, however, we will aim for a 7:30am notice. Bus companies will be informed along with parents.

If a closure decision is made during the day, we will Parentmail and post on our website and Facebook. We will also publish a time for student collection. Please note the Buntingford staff and the Head will not leave the site until all students are accounted for.

On the day, once the decision is made, the following will happen in school:

- 1) Students will return to their tutor group, if they have a mobile phone, arrangements will be made for phones to be collected.
- 2) Paper copy registers will be provided by the Admin Team and Tutors will register students.
- 3) Bus students will be dismissed to the gym first, where the SLT will be waiting to escort them onto the buses.
- 4) KS3 siblings will be dismissed to collect their sibling and exit the school from the bottom gate if you have given permission.
- 5) KS3 students who have permission to walk home will be dismissed from the bottom gate if you have given permission.
- 6) KS3 students who are required to wait for a parent or designated adult, will wait in their tutor room with their tutor.
- 7) KS2 tutors will dismiss students who have permission to walk home from the bottom exit gate and students once registered, will wait in their tutor room to be collected
- 8) Parents and designated adults, will register at reception and then collect their child from their tutor room
