What events are taking place next week?

Year 7 & 8 Autumn walk are next Tuesday, the 15^{th} November – please read below for details.

Next Friday the 18th November, we will offer a nonschool uniform day for those that wish to participate with a voluntary donation of £1 to go towards Children in Need. If your child prefers to stay in school uniform this is always fine. Payment will be available via School Gateway.

How are we managing PE now with muddy fields

What have students been thinking about in COWO?

We have been exploring the value of Reverence and how understanding this value and the virtues it creates in us might help us with our lives. We took time to think about the traditional, and Church meaning to Hallows day and Hallows Eve. We have learnt that whilst it is fun to dress up it is actually a time to celebrate All Saints day – and all Souls day. In particular we thought about the quote below – acknowledging that this can be a time to remember with fondness our loved ones who have passed on and talking about them keeps them in our hearts and minds.

When will the school photos be taking place and will we get them for Christmas?

We will be offering your child the opportunity to have a school photo on the 22^{nd} and/ or 23^{rd} of November. Sibling photos will also be included. The Photography company has guaranteed that if you meet the deadline for confirming that you would like to purchase photos, then they will get them back in time for Christmas.

What is the arrangement for winter play at breaks and lunch times?

We are moving the children off the main play areas on the field as the field becomes too wet and muddy to be safe to play on. Students have been briefed about what is happening. Lunchtime will be split into time spent indoors eating, including packed lunches in sessions 5 & 7 and 8 & 6, then time outside. As we have expanded as a school in recent years, our winter play does not involve football as there is not enough space for them to safely play. Year 5 & 6 will be allowed to bring in tennis balls, and Year 7 & 8 will be allowed to bring basketballs. We will be providing equipment for them to play with as well.

Can you help with Lost uniform?

May we ask you to check your child's uniform name tags at home in case your child has mistakenly bought home someone else's PE kit? This can happen, and does happen often. If you find yourself in this situation please drop items off at our reception and we will return them to the right owner. Please may we stress If you name your child's uniform, it is much more likely to return to you. Thank you for your support.
