SIAMS Inspection – a message from the inspectorate.

All Church of England and Methodist schools are inspected approximately every five years by a SIAMS inspector from the Church of England. We will be inspected on 18 June 2025.

A SIAMS inspection is an opportunity to highlight the impact that the school's Christian vision has on the flourishing of the whole school community. As part of the inspector's evidence-gathering, they will speak with a range of people.

Following the inspection, they will write a report. Once the report has been finalised it will be published, and the inspection findings will be shared with you. This will be approximately three weeks after the inspection. The report will celebrate all that is special about the school and will identify next steps that are helpful in the school's ongoing development as a Church school.

The report will be published on the school's website, as well as on the SIAMS website, and I would encourage you to read it.

What is our value in COWO and what have we begun to think about.

Our last value for this term is *Compassion* and we are learning that this is not a value that just means sympathy, which is good but can lead to pedestals where we might look down on others. It is more than this, it is clothing yourself in someone else's experience, "**clothe yourselves, compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.'** (Colossian 3:12)

In the last two weeks, we have heard Years 7 and 8 talking about illegal immigrants, a topic of concern for all of us. We have been learning in COWO that no matter how difficult the problem, we should not forget compassion. These are humans who are taking huge risks in the boat crossing. Sports Day (all years)

This year's sports day will take place on 25th June 2025 and will last the whole day.

Children will need to come to school in their PE kits (PE shirt, black shorts, white socks, and trainers) and will not need their school uniforms or books.

As children will be outside for the full day, please ensure that they are suitably equipped for the weather. Please ensure that your child has a named water bottle, sun cream and a cap if it is sunny, and their hoody if it is cold.

The school day will begin and end at normal times. Parents are welcome to attend sports day from 11:00am. This will give you the opportunity to see your child compete in a minimum of four of the activity rotations. Access will be via the bottom gate only and the events will be taking place on the field and in the tennis courts.

During the day, children will rotate around activities in form groups competing against each other in their houses. Following the morning's activities, we will hold a picnic lunch on the school field from 12:45pm. Please remember we are a nut free school. Following the picnic lunch, we will host several relay races which the pupils have signed up to compete in. If your child signed up, you will receive an invite to stay after the picnic lunch to watch. Otherwise, we will ask you to leave at the end of lunch as your child returns to lessons.

Year 5 English Feedback from Foundation Evening

You said: The Year 5 spellings are too hard for my child. We did: We can confirm that there are differentiated spelling groups in Year 5, but if you feel your child is being set spellings that are too difficult for them, please let their English teacher know.

You said: You could not see a clear enough link between the Year 5 English Home Learning and the work they are doing in class. We did: We are investigating how we can improve English Home Learning to more closely link it to their class work.

The Carers Trust estimates that 1 in 5 school-aged children could be young carers. Yet in Hertfordshire, the January 2025 School Census found that 60% of schools reported no known young carers, Identified only 1,483 young carers out of approx. 200,000 pupils. The 2021 Census recorded just 2,525 young carers aged 5–17.
