Non-uniform day Friday 26th January for the Isobel Hospice.

We have a year 5 student whose parent is currently under the care of Isobel Hospice. They are feeling incredibly grateful to the hospice for all their support. The student has asked if the school would host a non-uniform day with a £1 voluntary donation to support the hospice. As we have only one charity fund raising event planned and your parent questionnaire feedback told us you could support two. We will go ahead with this on Friday $26^{\rm th}$ January.

Bake Sale

On 13th of February we will be hosting a bake sale to help raise money to support our first Fullness day. These are learning days that happen throughout the year, 3 in total to explore topics that students have raised as of interest and/or importance. The dynamic diversity group have requested a day to explore and learn about differently abled people and neuro diversity, in order to boost our whole schools understanding of difference. This will take place in March, but to support some outside agency speakers, we would like to raise a little money to help. Hence the need for a bake sale. As always donations can be dropped to the school during this week. Thank you to the amazing bakers and kind buyers who help us to raise funds for projects inside and outside the school.

Can you help us with a campaign to upgrade our new crossing?

We have been asking our local Council for a crossing on Bowling Green Lane for years, and this year the Council have provided one. However, it is not to the standard of the crossing we were hoping for, and while the children know it is there, the cars do not. In fact, it is so inconspicuous that parents have remarked that it is almost causing more dangers being there than not. We are looking for an upgrade to a zebra crossing with road markings and flashing beacons which both pedestrians and car drivers can not miss. Could you help? We would like to go back to the Council with a set of signatures advocating for this upgrade. If you are willing to support us by signing our petition, students will be bringing home a copy of our petition signature form next week, and we would ask you to complete the form yourself and ask other interested parties if they would also support us (over 18's only please). Additional signature sheets will be available to collect from the school office. We would appreciate any assistance or ideas to help support our campaign.

Now the swimming pool is closed, how will we carry out compulsory swimming lessons?

Currently we do not know. We are looking at the nearest swimming pools and availability. However, the cost of transport is likely to prohibit this and would require a significant time out of the curriculum instead of the hour that we used to have. We understand that there is a movement to support the swimming pool to be taken over and run by the Community and we will look to find out more and support this movement. As a former child of Buntingford, my joy of swimming began at the pool and it seems desperate that the expansion of the town has led to its closure.

Would you consider becoming a Parent Governor?

We are looking to recruit one more Parent Governor. This is a role that requires you to act as a critical friend to the school, and to steer and guide us. We have a strong Governing body who are experienced but who welcome parents' viewpoints. School Reports

This year we are trialling an alternative way to send out school reports. We provide 3 sets of reports, 2 tracking progress and 1 in the summer outlining your child's learning. The first data report for term 1 is due shortly and we are going to trial a new method of delivery electronically and via the Satchel 1 app.

Instead of sending home a paper copy, school reports will be issued through the Satchel One app. The advantage of issuing school reports electronically is that they cannot get lost on the way home, are easier to store and can be viewed by accessing your parent account in Satchel One. We will be providing training through the newsletter, a video link and a help line to guide you on how to access the reports.

We expect the school reports to be issued by the first week of February and will send a Parentmail out to confirm once they have been issued.
