# **New School Uniform**

The early cut-off date enables parents to return any unwanted items in good time where necessary and, by spreading the workload in our warehouse, enables us to provide parents with the best possible service.

# Will my child be changing class next year?

Year 5 and 7 will transition in their current forms into year 6 and 8. Our one change of class takes place for year 6 who will move into year 7. We change classes as students move key stages, in order to ensure they do not become too fixed with their class. It also offers them a chance to again expand their friendship base. All students are asked who they wish to be with and at least one friend will go with them in the move.

# Food and Nutrition (all years):

Due to health and safety requirements, all pupils need to be present at a practical demonstration in class before being allowed to cook. We cover specific safety requirements for each recipe in the kitchen each time. Unfortunately, that means if your child has been absent from the demo lesson, they will not be allowed to cook. Alternate work is always provided to anyone who is not cooking.

# Year 8 news:

#### Camp Out

Year 8 have requested the annual camp out at Edwinstree as their end of term event. This is due to take place on the 5th of July.

Since COVID this has become the annual right of passage for year 8 leaving the school, all students in year 8 are welcome. We ask students to group together as friends and to see who has tents, in the past most friends have been able to find a family tent between them, but we do have 5 x 2-man tents if students do not.

We will ask you to pitch their tent on Friday afternoon any time after 4.30pm on the school field, we will be there to show you where to do this. #### Edwinstree Dramatic Enquiry Pilot Project

The two classes who currently have French at Freman (8A and 8B) are being given the opportunity to take part in a new Drama pilot with Freman's Drama department and Hertford Theatre. They will be going up to Freman for the lesson before their normal French lesson, returning at the normal time. For the first session, students will be supervised by a member of staff from Edwinstree but after that, they will walked up to Freman as they are when they go to French.

Below is an explanation from Ms Wallace who will be running the project at Freman. We are looking forward to seeing the outcome!

Students will be participating in an exciting pilot of a new teaching approach called Dramatic Enquiry, piloted by BEAM (formerly known as The Hertford Theatre) and other arts partners. Dramatic Enquiry encourages students to practically explore a chosen topic through drama, ideally when they are experiencing a pivotal point of change in their lives. The approach is intended to benefit students' self-esteem, active classroom engagement, enjoyment in learning, critical thinking, communication skills, creativity and social/emotional wellbeing. Through our Dramatic Enquiry, students will be exploring their sense of self identity and what makes each student an individual. It is hoped that this experience will foster their sense of belonging when they arrive at Freman College and aid their smooth transition in September.
