How to communicate effectively with the school and ensure that all our community are supported.

Having grown up in our local community and now served as the Head of Edwinstree for 9 years, I know that Edwinstree has a well-deserved reputation of care and community to all. This does not mean that we believe we get everything right, but it does mean that we are open, honest and committed to working with you and learning from mistakes that we make.

I therefore ask that you use our well documented forms of communication for any concern or worry about any member of the community. You can email, and/or call within the school opening hours to get support

When you do approach us, we assure you that we will listen and take your concern seriously. As we say at the beginning of our journey with you in the Summer your child transitions to us, no problem is too small, we are here to listen and help.

Social media is not a method of communication with us and often is a source of inaccurate information about us. They are not effective places to solve problems or concerns with the school. Naming any member of our community, child, parent and/or staff member is damaging to all the individuals involved.

WhatsApp group bullying and why was it the focus of the National Anti Bullying Campaign?

Students have been thinking about group bullying this week. This explores both one line and off behaviour. The students and staff found this slide and definitions of the different characters in a bullying situation can operate really helpful. We will be continuing to explore this next week.



What is our snow procedure?

If your child lives in Buntingford and is KS2, [Year 5 or Year 6] please be aware we cannot release your child from school without a designated person to collect them. Please confirm the name of the designated person[s] permitted to collect your child from school. If your KS2 child has an older sibling in KS3, please indicate that you are happy for both of them to go home together.

If your child lives in Buntingford and is KS3 [Year 7 or Year 8] and you are happy for your child to be released from school, without adult supervision, please give permission for your child to walk home and confirm they have a key to get in. Please indicate if you wish your child to wait for your designated person[s] to collect them from school. Please be aware we cannot release your child from school without written parental consent. Buses maybe early if snow is forecast.

Eyesight

We usually contact parents directly but there are currently so many children reporting eyesight concern, we decided to ask, if you could check in with your child and if they have any eye-sight concerns and book an appointment with an optician if you discover they have been worried. Thank you
