When is the heating going on in school?

Three weeks ago, a leak was discovered in our electric control panel for the boilers that heat the main school block. The repair work is due to start over half term, but we have been informed that this will not be completed until the end of the first week of our return to school. We are therefore proposing that students and staff wear warm clothing for the first week of term, with the priority on keeping warm. This will only affect the main school block; the heating will be on in all other areas. While we will have electric heaters in classroom these are small and will not heat the space like the boilers. If your child is averse to change and would rather wear their uniform that is fine.

On PE days students will need to bring their winter PE kit as this is the season where PE kits get very muddy.

Updates on winter uniform:

As we enter the winter months you might be purchasing a new coat for your child, we love the brightest, loudest coats that mean students can be seen by traffic, so please do not worry about colour we want them to be seen!

We have a number of unnamed winter coats that have been left in school since before the summer holidays and we would like to find new homes for them.

During the week of half term, the coats will be displayed in the school foyer, and you are welcome to visit the school and choose a coat to take home with you free of charge.

May we take this opportunity to strongly advise that you clearly name you child's winter coat so that it can be identified should it be lost.

Acrylic nails - please resist the temptation or pressure to purchase for your child, it means they are unable to take part in Science, Food and Nutrition and Technology when they have them. There is plenty of time for these in their future.

If you have any concerns about your child's mental health, we encourage you to reach out to us or explore these local resources. In Hertfordshire, there are a range of services available to support children, young people, and families with mental health and emotional wellbeing. These include:

- Hertfordshire's Children and Young People's Mental Health Services (CAMHS): Providing specialist support for young people experiencing significant mental health difficulties.
- Your GP Practice: Your GP can also refer you to a psychological therapy service or a specialist mental health service for further advice or treatment. The treatment may be provided on a one-to-one basis or in a group with others with similar problems. Therapy can also sometimes involve partners and families.
- Step2 and The Wellbeing Service: Offering early intervention and short-term support for young people dealing with anxiety, low mood, and stress. <u>Award-</u>

Parking outside of school and update email from our Police and Community Officer who is supporting the school to keep the drop off and pickups as safe as possible for the students.

Since the beginning of the term, I have attended a couple of mornings and afternoons and have moved people on from both the bus stop and the zig zags outside the school gates. The morning of Friday 3rd October was particularly bad, with some drivers indignant and or quite rude when it was explained that they couldn't stop in these areas. I know SLT has experienced similar problems. These drivers didn't appear to comprehend that the virtual gridlock on the road could be reduced, if they just dropped their children in the free parking of Bowling Green Lane Car Park, where they could then cross safely with the Crossing Guard.

An officer and I carried out a second visit on the morning of Monday 13th October. Several drivers were recorded on Body Worn Video committing the offence of; Motor Vehicle Fail to Comply with Zig Zag Road Markings in the Vicinity of a School, contrary to section 36(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1988 and the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016. The owners of these vehicles have each been sent a Notice of Intended Prosecution in order to identify the drivers and issue them with a Fixed Penalty.

Our police community team will continue to support the work of our Deputy Head to encourage you to please find a safe space for drop offs and pickups allowing buses to park in the bus lane close to the gates. Thank you to the huge number of parents who adhere to this already.

HPCI 4th Annual SEND Survey (2025)
