Year 6 in-Person Foundation Parents Evening

As you will have seen from the Newsletter dates, we have a Year 6 Foundation Evening on 8th May from 5pm until 7pm, this is held in school and is a chance for your child to bring you into school, take you to their classrooms and show you the work they have been completing in their subjects. Foundation subject teachers will be in their classrooms for any questions you may have. You are not required to book a time slot.

A slight change from last year - and in response to parent feedback - we will ensure that your child's core books (English, Maths and Science) will be available for you to look at during the evening.

Year 8 Transition

We look forward to working with you in the last term as our students transition to Freman, an information letter will be out soon to explain the process and to ask you to alert us if you think your child may need additional support for transition. Freman are excellent at offering additional sessions at the school post half term for those students feeling extra nervous about the change.

Food and Nutrition:

It was so lovely to see so many pupils following the health and safety rules with the correct unform in the kitchen this week. There were still a few sets of false/gel nails and incorrect shoes which I am hoping will be rectified before their next lesson as most classes are cooking next week.

- Incorrect uniform will result in a no cook lesson.
- Please note that unless otherwise informed, if your child was absent from the demo lesson, they will not be cooking - alternate work is always provided.

- All ingredient requirements are on SatchelOne
 - Please remember that if your child has an allergy/intolerance or food preference, to change an item, we want pupils to enjoy their own cooking creations.
- ALL INGREDIENTS to be named and dropped off first thing on the day of your practical outside the Food Room. No shopping bags are allowed in the fridge, so please label all ingredients.
- Please send in only the required amount of ingredient. There is only 1 fridge in the Food Room and if 4 classes are cooking on the same day, space is very limited.

Year 5: Now that we have completed pizza taste testing and seen what our preferences are, how different ingredients impact the flavour, and different types of ingredients that can be used, it is your turn to create your own favourite pizza. **5B** and **5D** please make sure you bring in your design and your ingredients for your pizza projects. Please remember the design is the most important part of the project. As mentioned on SatchelOne and in class, if the design is not brought in, you will not be allowed to cook - the design is more important than the practical this week. **5A** and **5C** will be looking at creating your design next week and cooking the following week.

Year 6: **6B, 6C** and **6D** ingredients needed for sugar alternate cupcakes – remember a more ripe, spotty or brown banana is much sweeter and easier to use if it has been frozen. If you are bringing in butter, please leave it out of the fridge the night before, or it will be too hard to use. Please ensure you are bringing in a suitable a container to take your completed products home in. Make sure your eggs are wrapped carefully as you don't want broken eggs. School will provide the cupcake cases.

Year 7: Spaghetti Bolognese. Please remember a container BIG enough for your end-product. A chocolate tub is about the right size for this dish. Please remember to bring in the amount of ingredients you will use in your dish — do not bring in extra — 250g mince is more than enough to feed a family of 4/5 with all the extra hidden veggies you are putting in. If you were absent from our Classic Vegetable Cuts lesson, remember to prepare your carrot and onion at home as your time is limited in the classroom. School will provide tomatoes (for those who requested them via SatchelOne) as well as oil, pepper and herbs for each pupil.

Year 8: **8B** will be the only class cooking. **8A**, **8C** and **8D** will have demo lessons and will cook in their next lesson. You will be creating a curry of your own choosing using a protein alternate – no beef, chicken, pork, fish etc. Spice pots will be made up for those who would like one – please let me know via SatchelOne if you require a premade pot – no chilli is included in the spice pot. Oil is provided, you do not need to bring this in.

REMEMBER you are welcome to make changes and adaptions as necessary to recipe requirements so that you can enjoy the product you are creating. Please send through any questions via SatchelOne. Mrs van Wyk
