### Year 8 Academic Reviews

Year 8 parent/carers will get a chance to book an online appointment to meet their child's English, Maths and Science teachers, as well as their tutor, on the following days:

The window for booking these appointments for all tutor groups will open on Monday  $11^{\rm th}$  November. We will send out instructions on how to book and confirm a time that the booking window opens after half term. A SEND representative and a Governor will also be available and you can book in a session with them if you wish.

We are conscious that in 1 year's time your child will be close to deciding, as a year 9 what GCSE option subjects they wish to take and which to drop. We have therefore moved the foundation subject meetings earlier. The opportunity to meet the Year 8 Foundation subject teachers takes place on Thursday 23rd January from 5pm to 7pm.

Academic Reviews and Foundation evenings for other year groups will take place in the Spring and Summer term.

# All Years Maths Equipment

Whiteboard pens: In maths we do a lot of work on mini whiteboards. This allows students to try out their ideas, and the teacher to assess the understanding of the class. Please ensure that your child comes to every maths lesson with a working whiteboard pen so that they can partake in the lessons.

Sharp pencil: In maths students write in their books in pencil, this allows them to correct mistakes, particularly when drawing tables and graphs. Please ensure that your child brings a sharp pencil to each lesson.

Scientific Calculator: Years 7 & 8 students are required to use a scientific calculator. Please make sure that your child brings one to every maths lesson.
