Adolescence Netflix Series & Gareth Southgate Speech

Many members of our community have watched and are talking about the shocking Netflix drama Adolescence as well as the powerful speech by Gareth Southgate last week. As a school we have been starting to think how we should respond to both of these. The Adolescence series was certainly incredibly intense and highlighted so many aspects including misogyny, knife-crime as well as being a boy or girl in modern Britain.

We recognise that we have to be careful with the Adolescence series as it has a 15-age rating and most of the PSHE communities are suggesting we should step back directly from showing any of the series with our age of children. However, as a result of this series we have introduced a new lesson for our older children (year 8) about the topic of misogyny which also looks at sexism. We are thinking whether we can deliver a "lighter touch" version to the younger year groups and our Dynamic Diversity Group will be looking into this - we are not yet sure whether this will be a fullness day, additional lessons, or an alternate form.

Alongside this we are looking at whether we can deliver a separate girls and boys session this year which will include aspects of the above such as "What does it mean to be a boy/girl in our world today?" Over the last few days many staff have also had training on aspects of VAWG (Violence Against Women and Girls) which included many of the concerning aspects of the series and extended to some of the more complex parts of the series, such as the meaning of the different emojis within the series.

The school have been lucky enough to have the police coming in again this year to talk to our older children about the topic of knife-crime, which was also a major aspect of the Adolescence series.

Year 6 (current) Residential for September 25

If your child is unsure about attending the Residential in September, Mr McCarthy will hold a brief information meeting on Monday 31st March 2025 at 3.30pm, in school.

We will hold open the deposit deadline until after this meeting. Since Covid, children have been more apprehensive about the idea of a residential, however this is a chance to make great memories and a bonding experience.

Year 6 Home Learning

Over the Easter break, we have found it really helps students to dip in and out of SATs revision. In this way, wellbeing is supported, and students return without the feeling that they have forgotten everything - it means faster return to focus and learning. Just a little work stops them from worrying.

English

Before half term students will receive one set of practice papers (Reading, and GPS) and an answer booklet. There is a spelling test in the middle of the GPS booklet. Please remove and use the spellings in the answer booklet.

Please encourage your child to find time for some SATs revision by completing the practice papers - a little over time works well for most. Please mark and discuss. Plus... don't forget to read!

Maths

Students will be sent home with 10 suggested pages from their CGP revision book. It is generally preferable to spend about 15-20 mins each day on this, rather than trying to complete everything in one go. A good idea is to set a timer and complete a short burst of focussed work.

Year 7 & 8 Lifeskills Topic

Year 8 will shortly be moving onto the topic of Substances. In this topic there will be talk of caffeine, energy drinks, smoking, vaping, alcohol and also some mention of illegal drugs and their different classifications. Later in the year we are planning to teach a more limited version of this to year 7, with much of the mention of illegal drugs omitted.

Year 8 What is happening with transition to Freman?

After Easter, Freman will ask us to compile data on our students and begin the process of hand over. After May half term we will ask you to let us know if you think your child will benefit from additional transition and more visits to Freman than the statutory transition day which takes place on Thursday 10th July. A letter will come out providing a link for you to nominate your child. For now, year 8 seem excited for their new transition and the French teaching at Freman has once again supported them to know and experience the school.
