What is happening on strike days (5th and 7^{th} of July)?

Edwinstree will be closed on the 5th of July to all students. This link takes you to the distance learning that your child can access on the day.

We are also actively encouraging students to log on to Satchel One, where they will find posted teams links to live lessons on the day, where staff are not striking and in school. We are sorry, we are unable to publish these in advance. Where there are no live lessons, they are able to use the distance learning to complete topics that they are working on in each of their subjects.

What about vulnerable and key workers?

With expected numbers of teachers striking we do not have a facility for significant numbers of vulnerable and/or key workers children. Next week Ms Marler will be phoning our most vulnerable to discuss support. We may still say we can't support but we will try. Please only ask if you really have no other option.

Please note, if you do require support it will involve your child working on distance learning in the computer suite. Not covered lessons.

On this Collapsed Curriculum Day, we are asking our students one of the Key Questions of our time: *"How can I make a difference to make our local area more sustainable?"*

We are taking groups of students to learn from local farmers, nature reserve wardens, the local chalk stream society and many other sustainability activists so that by the end of the day, hopefully they will have come up with some good answers.

To assess their answers, and to add some of their own, we are hosting, in partnership with Peace Child International, an "Intergenerational Conversation Café" – which allows you to have serious conversations with your children about the most effective answers to this crucial question.
