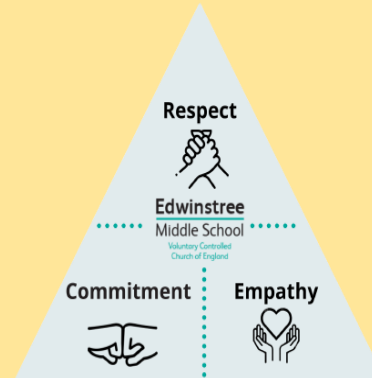

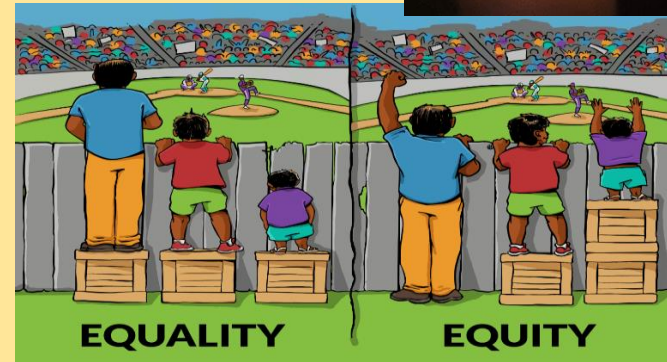

The Link between home learning and SATS Success

Over the years we have found that students who complete home learning are more likely to be successful in their SATs.

We believe that home support has a great role to play - your interest in home learning can really make a difference to test outcomes!

Home learning support is provided in school - please speak to a member of staff if you would like to discuss this.

Easter Home learning

We have found that doing a little thinking is good for wellbeing and students are quicker to engage on their return to school.

English

- Please read daily and talk about what you are reading.
- Students will be sent home practice test papers.

Maths

- Students will be set specific pages from their CGP book: little and often is best.
- Go to [gov.uk](https://www.gov.uk) website or [satspapers.org.uk](https://www.satspapers.org.uk) to find old SATS papers if your child would like to use these.
- Do not use 2023 or 2024 papers until after mock SATS
